



## SCHNITZELBANK

'Sauerkraut, Steins & a Song'

"*Ist das nicht eine Schnitzelbank?*" bellows from the Glockenspiel outside. On a particular lively day, a rousing rendition can even be heard from a group indoors. The answer to the question is, "Yes this is a schnitzelbank"; but not the woodworking bench to which the song refers. This schnitzelbank is the Schnitzelbank Restaurant, located in the rolling hills of southern Indiana's town of Jasper. The song sounds better with a delicious platter of bratwurst and sauerkraut and a full stein of your favorite German beer. But more than just sauerkraut, steins, and a legendary German song, the Schnitzelbank serves a variety of both German and American cuisine and has been doing so since 1961 through three generations of the Hanselman family. Clad in traditional German smocks and lederhosen, the Hanselmans and their staff will make sure you enjoy not only the delectable food, but the experience.

### *Snippets of other information:*

- The Schnitzelbank is ranked among the top 10 of Independent Restaurants in Indiana by the Association of Cities and Towns.
- The restaurant has expanded into a "hot-on-the-spot" catering business, where food is prepared in mobile kitchens.
- The extensive bar selection includes German wheat beer, several German draft beers, German schnapps and a variety of German and Indiana wines.
- Some highlights of the menu include 2" thick smoked pork chops, fried chicken, German fried potatoes, Kraut Balls, and for dessert, German chocolate pie and famous Apple Strudel with cinnamon ice cream.
- A German buffet is served during the Strassenfest, a well-known annual German festival held the first weekend in August.
- The Glockenspiel is an animated clock outside the restaurant that plays every half hour.
